Welcome back! It's great to see the students back in the building, finding their classes and getting to class on time. Please reinforce with your child if they have any issues to talk to their teacher or someone in the office.

i-Ready

Just an FYI we will start the fall i-Ready math and reading diagnostic on Thursday, September 14 and will continue the week of September 18 – 22 during Eagle Time. There will be no testing on Friday, September 15 due to bonding day.

Drop Off

When dropping off your child in the morning in the half circle please use the left lane. Please remember to pull all the way up to allow more cars to enter the drop off area. Remember, have your child be quick getting out of the car. Thank you for keeping our students safe!

Attendance

Just a reminder that if your child is going to be sick or tardy please call the school office at 920-852-5420 between 7:00 – 8:00 AM to inform school officials of your child's absence or tardiness and the reason for it. **If a student is not called in, those students are marked unexcused**. Those students who are not in their appropriate classroom and ready for class when the bell rings at 7:50 AM are considered tardy. Students that receive 3 tardies will then serve a detention. These tardies can be to school or to classes during the day. If tardies become chronic, additional measures will be taken.

Students are also allowed to miss up to 10 days during the school year. <u>Please don't use all of those days up</u> <u>right away.</u> After 10 missed days of school we will ask for a doctor's excuse. Regular attendance is a necessary factor in achieving success. Work missed can never be made up in a completely satisfactory manner because the value of class activities is missed forever.

Bully & Incident Reporting – Speak Up, Speak Out

If you think there's a threat to you, a friend, your school, or the community, don't wait. **SPEAK UP, SPEAK OUT** with an anonymous tip that can bring much-needed help. The **SPEAK UP, SPEAK OUT** School Resource Center isn't just for students. Parents and community members can submit a confidential tip when they notice unsafe or risky behaviors that might be putting their child, other children, or the community in danger.

Students, parents, school staff, or any community members can submit a school safety concern or threat via a website, mobile phone application, or toll-free number. We recommend typing in "AASD" into the search field to see all AASD schools.

- You may also make a report using your smartphone by downloading the SPEAK UP, SPEAK OUT app from the <u>Apple Store</u> and <u>Google Play</u>
- or by calling 1-800-MY-SUSO-1 to speak to a resource center analyst.

Call 911 if this is an emergency or a crime in progress.

This system can be used to identify not just threats to schools, but also other daily safety concerns students encounter, such as bullying, drug use, self-harm, suicidal thoughts, and more. Resource center staff work around-the-clock to respond to tips and to deploy a response locally by communicating directly with school administrators, law enforcement, and counselors.

Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS)

Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS) is the framework that we use to teach our school-wide expectations to prevent unwanted behaviors. We have set up monthly incentives that focus on a targeted skill. We will share the monthly incentives with you in our newsletters. To get the year started, we want to share September and October's incentive.

Attendance Incentive (Sept. 5th-29th)

- Attendance checks throughout September
- September 22nd plus two other random days
- Students in attendance on those days will receive a surprise at the end of the school day

What Is Needed To Play Sports

The majority of the paperwork that has been filled out in the past with paper/pencil will now be done online electronically in a google form. Please click the link below for the online form that you can fill out if your child is going to take part in a co-curricular/sport at Einstein Middle School during the 2023-24 school year. Each athlete has to have one completed form each school year. If you have multiple children participating, you will need to fill out one form for each. A \$40 participation fee for each sport should be turned into the office before each season.

- Hard copy still needed for...
 - Physical forms (good for 2 years)
 - Physicals have to be <u>signed and dated</u> by your medical provider.
 - <u>Physical forms need to be on file with Einstein Middle School before a student can</u> practice
- Forms that are now electronic
 - Concussion/Cardiac Arrest
 - Code of conduct
 - Liability waiver
 - Alternate year form (needed in year 2 of a physical)

Medication Forms


In compliance with Wisconsin State Law, the Appleton Area School District has adopted a policy for the administration of medications. For school personnel to administer medication safely and efficiently, parents/guardians and/or adult students must comply with district policy.

Medications should be administered at home whenever possible. Parents/guardians are urged to consult with the prescribing practitioner to determine if medications can be scheduled outside school hours. In the event that this is not possible, designated district staff will administer medication according to district policy (453.4)

This can be done by phone call, email, or parents/guardians can use the Absence Request found on <u>Campus Parent/Parent</u> Portal (https://appletonwi.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/appleton.jsptool) to submit a request that informs the office in advance when their student is not going to be in school.

Reminder to online register



Annual student registration is required for students grades K - 12. Registration should be completed by the primary household of current families each <u>July</u> via the **Infinite Campus Parent Portal** at: <u>https://appletonwi.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/appleton.jsp</u>

When logged into the Parent Portal, select "More" and then "Online Registration" located in the left side menu.

Click "Start" next to "Existing Student Annual Registration" to begin registration.

For each section follow the on-screen prompts. Click "Next" and "Save and Continue" to move through each section.

A red * indicates a required field and yellow highlights indicate missing information.

When you have finished, click "Submit".

You will then receive a confirmation email.

Registration is not complete until "Submit" is selected.

Students who earn a cumulative GPA of 3.66 and higher with no failing grades on report card (through 3rd quarter) will be invited, along with parents, to the Einstein **High Academic Honors** program in May. Students with a 4.0 GPA will be acknowledged.



Students who earn all 3's and 4's in Career and Life Skills (through 3rd quarter) AND have no more than one major behavior / NO ISS or OSS (entire year) will be acknowledged at the end of the school year during a grade-level celebration.
